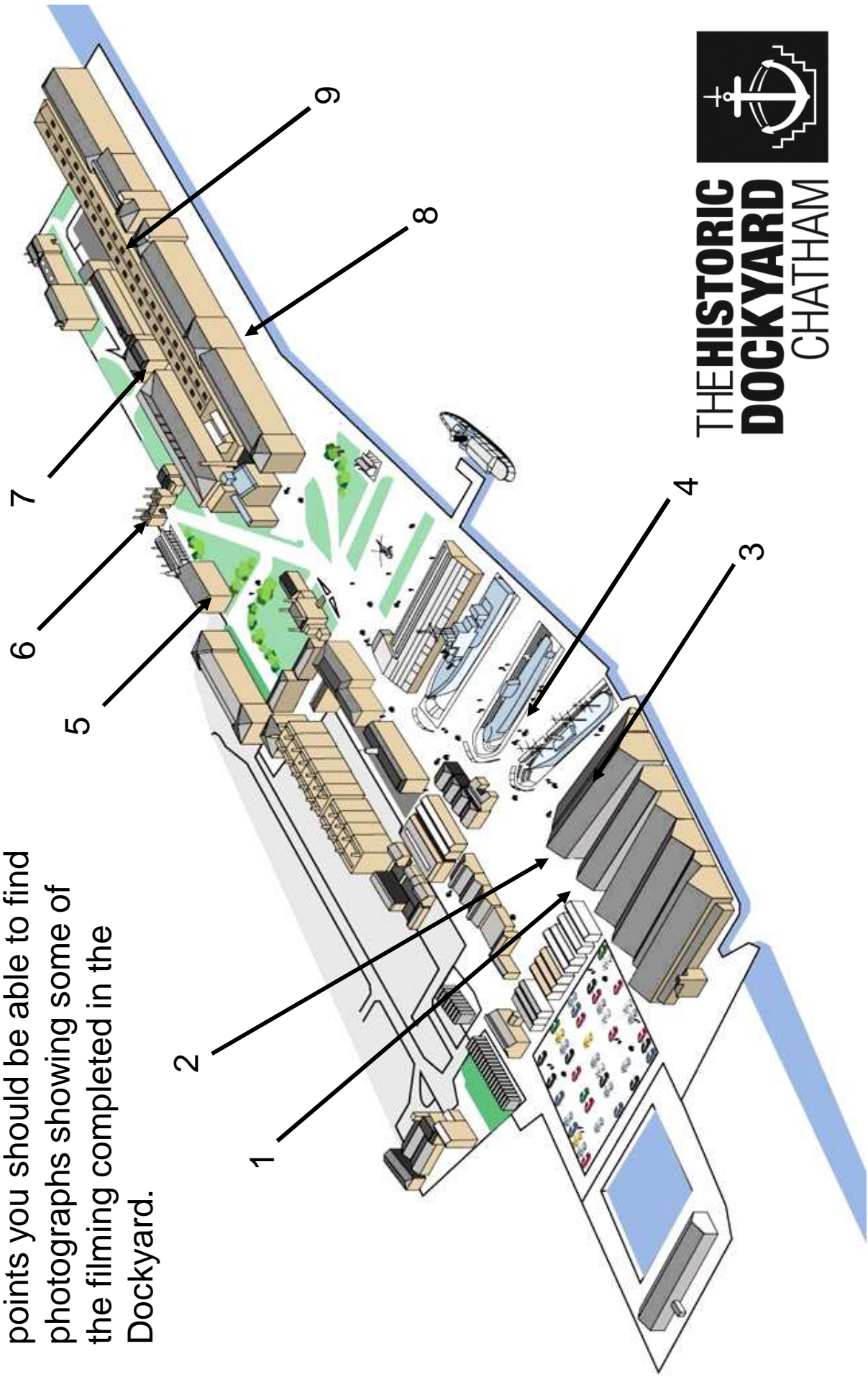


# The Historic Dockyard Film Trail

Near each of the numbered points you should be able to find photographs showing some of the filming completed in the Dockyard.



## Further information

1. Here the yard stood in for a Norwegian port complete with boats, cranes, buildings and crates (and a polar bear).
2. For the same film as number 1, it was here that the main character first met the aeronaut Lee Scoresby.
3. In this film the building stood in for a space in London – albeit a very different London to our own. Unlike number 2, this scene was filmed on the upper floor, so you'll need to go up there to find the photographs.
4. The film title for this one is the Bond family motto (in Latin “Orbis non sufficit”). The mini sub you're looking for was used in the closing stages of the film and full size would be about twice the length of HMSm Ocelot.
5. This anti-slavery film used the Royal Dockyard Church as the Houses of Parliament (and some Dockyard staff and volunteers as extras!).
6. Main Gate has been used in several films – and more often than not as the entrance to a prison. In this case it stood in as the entrance to Pentonville.
7. The White Yarn Store was used as an exterior and interior set for this film and served as the entrance to the Punchbowl pub and as the interior bar and boxing ring.
8. Anchor Wharf was seen in a completely different light in this 1999 film as Cairo's docks where the heroes boarded a boat to take them up the Nile.
9. The same film as 6 and 7, this area was filmed as the prison yard at Pentonville, but has been used in TV series and the Bond film mentioned in number 4 where it stood in for London's Docklands.



Although all of the photos you are trying to find on the trail are of *films* that were shot here, we have also provided locations for several TV series. The photos to the right show the Dockyard as seen in BBC's *Oliver Twist* (the same building in fact as number 7 on the trail) and in the BBC dramas, the *Sally Lockhart Mysteries* starring Billie Piper (see if you can recognise the archways while you are at number 9). Other TV work has included *Art Attack*, *Foyles War*, *Coast*, *Horizon*, *Around the World in 80 Days* and *Canterbury Tales*.
